

Instructions for upholstery cleaning and maintenance for BEJOT products

Products of BEJOT are made of high-quality materials.

In order to ensure the long-term use of the upholstered furniture, special care should be taken in cleaning them.

Depending upon a type of the upholstery, certain rules must be observed concerning how to clean the different surfaces.

Never pour cleaning products directly on the upholstery.

If the liquid is applied directly to the surface of the material, the manufacturer will not be liable for any damage suffered.

WARNING! Always conduct a cleaning test in the invisible, hidden places, preferably in the rear part of the furniture.

DO NOT CLEAN WITH THE USE OF CHEMICAL AGENTS!

Instead of the use of a chemically inert soap, you can try a commercially available attested upholstery cleaner, while adhering to the rules provided in the instructions for use of the concerned agent.

How to clean respective types of upholstery:

Fabrics

- Act promptly.
- Remove dirt with a white, soft and dry cloth or kitchen roll.
- Remains of soiling should be removed with a white, cotton cloth gently soaked in water with the addition of a chemically inert soap.
- Treat a stain from the outer edge towards the inside in order to avoid spreading.
- Do not rub in to prevent a stain from spreading or penetrating into the fabric.
- For the purposes of removing, use only non-dyed cloths or a well-wrung sponge.
- Cloth or sponge should be rinsed in clean water and squeezed very well.
- Dry a soiled area with a white cotton cloth.
- Do not use the furniture until the upholstery is completely dry.
- In case of the velour fabrics, gently comb the surface with a soft brush along a direction of the nap.

Leather

- Act promptly.
- Stains and soiling should be removed with a white, soft and dry cloth or kitchen roll.
- Remains of soiling should be removed with a white, soft, cotton cloth soaked in a solution consisting of 50% water and 50% alcohol, or a broadly available, attested cleaning agent for the natural leather, while adhering to the rules provided in the instructions for use of the concerned agent.
- Upon a removal of the stain, dry out the upholstery by wiping it up gently.

- Do not use the furniture until the upholstery is completely dry.

Artificial Leather

- Stains and soiling should be removed promptly with a white, soft and dry cloth or kitchen roll.
- Remains of soiling should be removed with a white, soft cotton cloth gently soaked in water with the addition of a chemically inert soap.
- Wash with a cloth using the pure lukewarm water, and then wipe it dry.
- For the purposes of the public buildings, we suggest using dark colours of the fabric, as a pigmentation by the jeans or other fabrics is not subject to complaint.
- Do not use the furniture until the upholstery is completely dry.
- Cleaning artificial leather with alcohol-based agents can cause its stiffness and permanent damage.
